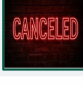

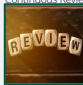

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Veterinary Care Standards
For Dogs



Section §3.13 requires facilities to develop a **Program of Veterinary Care** for dogs.

- November 2020
- Program of Veterinary Care – APHIS Form 7002
 - Scheduled visit by Attending Veterinarian no less than once every 12m
 - Annual physical exam
 - Vaccinations
 - Treatment for parasites and pests
 - Preventative care plans
 - Medical records
- Continuous access to potable water

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Contingency Plan USDA



The contingency planning rule took effect on January 3, 2022.

- Stay from July 31, 2013 lifted
- Required for all licensees and registrants
 - Identify emergency situations common to facility's local area
 - Outline specific tasks in response to identified emergencies/disasters
 - Identify chain of command
 - Address recovery
- Reviewed no less than annually
- Employee training
- APHS form 7093 (optional)


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Inspection Guidance / Semiannual Reviews USDA



- Unannounced and in-person inspections following county and CDC COVID-19 guidelines
- As of 1 OCT 2022, discontinued delay of semi-annual reviews
 - Flexibilities for conducting semi-annual program review maintained

Publication Final Rule

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Registration: Research

Birds that are bred for use in research are not covered by the Animal Welfare Act.

"Bred for use in research" means an animal that is bred in captivity and used for research, teaching, testing, or experimentation purposes.



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Excluded

- Field studies that do not materially alter the birds, such as observational studies.
- Studies for the purpose of supporting agriculture (intended to improve the quality of food or feathers).
- Animal, pest, and population management studies for the purposes of limiting wildlife damage and human interaction.
- Studies involving avian patients in clinical trials under a veterinary-client-patient relationship.
- Use of only dead biologic specimens—no live animals.



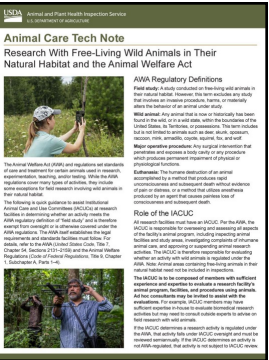
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Field Studies

Field study: A study conducted on free-living wild animals in their natural habitat. However, this term excludes any study that involves an invasive procedure, harms, or materially alters the behavior of an animal under study.

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Dates

- Already** registered research facilities must become compliant with the avian regulations by August 22nd, 2023
- Newly** registered research facilities must become compliant with the avian regulations by February 22nd, 2024
- Covered birds must be included on the Annual Report by Dec. 1st 2024

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Reporting Exceptions to the Standards and Regulations

- Some regulations and standards include provisions for exceptions or exemptions.
 - Euthanasia methods [2.31(d)(1)(vi)]
 - Exemption of individual NHP or bird from some or all of the environmental enhancement plan [3.81(e)(2); 3.154(e)]
 - Primary enclosure floor size requirements for "innovative housing"
 - Withholding of water from an NHP if required by the research protocol approved by the IACUC [3.83]
- All the provisions or conditions of the exception or exemption must be met.
- These exceptions and exemptions must be included in semiannual program review reports to the IO, but not on the annual report.



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Reporting Exceptions to the Standards and Regulations

- The IACUC may approve exceptions to the regulations or standards when specified and justified in the animal use proposal [2.38(k)(1)].
 - Removal of nesting platforms from cat enclosures
 - Extension of interval for cleaning/sanitization of enclosures
 - Keeping animals in 24-hour dark cycle
 - Keeping animals in temperatures outside range described in Part 3 – Standards for Species
 - Not performing daily observations of all animals
 - Altered diets that are not wholesome to induce a disease condition
- These exceptions must be included in semiannual program review reports and the annual report.



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Reporting Exceptions to the Standards and Regulations: Summary



Semiannual Program Review Report

- All exceptions and exemptions to the standards and regulations
- Reasons for each departure

Annual Report

- IACUC-approved exceptions not provided for in the regulations and standards
- Explanation, species and number of animals affected

Do Not Report

- Exceptions to other documents (e.g. *The Guide for the Care and Use of Laboratory Animals*)

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Reporting Pain and Distress Categories on the Annual Report



Reporting can be prospective or retrospective.

Animals on long-term studies that cross multiple reporting period periods may be reported in different columns.

Column E is for animals that experienced unrelieved pain or distress as part of the research protocol.

- Does not include breakthrough or unanticipated pain or distress that is treated when recognized
